THUNDERBRIDGE BEACH



The Thunderbridge Bathing Beach is currently closed until further notice due to the pandemic. Recent activity and gatherings there have shown that social and physical distancing measures have been ignored (by individuals and groups of mixed households); respectively with lack of facial coverings on the beach when distances were not met; and trash and personal litter left on the ground.

Additionally, the beach area is very small, presenting difficulty in establishing and maintaining physical separation on the beach and within the small swimming area. The beach is not staffed and the health department, who customarily would conduct weekly bacteriological sampling and deliver samples to the a lab in Andover, is dedicating their time with limited staff to the COVID-19 response.

Fishing and Canoe/kayak access is permitted; however, the gate is closed. Please utilize the four other canoe/kayak launches/landings in Middleton including a landing less than 1/4 mile +/- away on the adjacent Peabody Street.

The status of the beach may change as the season goes on. We thank you for your understanding during this difficult and challenging season we are all in.
