
## THUNDERBRIDGE BEACH HAS BEEN RE-OPENED WITH COVID-19 RULES

### COVID-19 BEACH SAFETY RULES



1

**IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK,  
STAY HOME.**



2

**GENERAL DISTANCING**

Maintain at least 6' of distance from other beach-goers.



3

**BEACH DISTANCING**

Do not sit closer than 12' from your nearest neighbor in any direction.



4

**WEAR**

Masks are required when 6' of distance cannot be maintained.

**PREVENT THE SPREAD OF  
GERMS**

Wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer frequently.

**BE RESPECTFUL**

Avoid confrontation. Be kind, follow the rules and enjoy the beach!

## EFFECTIVE JULY 30th, THUNDERBRIDGE BEACH IN MIDDLETON

has been reopened by the Board of Selectmen. Users of the beach must conduct personal responsibility by following the COVID-19 beach rules for the beach and the swimming area.

- Reminder, please dispose of trash in the trash barrels provided by the Department of Public Works
- If the beach area is full and the appropriate 12 ft separation from your nearest neighbor/party is not achievable, please visit the beach at another time/day.
- Reminder, no jumping/diving off the bridge and no pets are allowed at the beach or in the water at Thunderbridge beach.
- The Health Department will continue to conduct bacteriological tests weekly of the beach water.

**Failure to comply with the COVID-19 rules may result in closure of the beach and swimming area for the season.**
